Plans for session 23/24

We plan to continue to carry out a number of targeted interventions across the school. These will include –

- Targeted after school clubs to increase participation

- Developing numeracy skills using the Building Fact Fluency resource
- Promoting family engagement in learning through home learning experiences for Primary 1 to 3.
- Working with families to increase attendance levels at school.
